

Grand Observatory, Ma-Ka-Ja-Man Scout Reservation Astronomers Mark Robienosky, PHD, BSA and Roger Von Grum BS, MS, PHD revealed to the scientific world that they have discovered the shadow of the sun on the earth's surface (Latitude 45° 22' N, Longitude 88°) at 00:11:45 AM today.

This data completes the preparatory research for their upcoming solar space mission. Dr. Von Grum answered questions concerning the impossibility of landing a manned spacecraft on the sun's surface by explaining "we will be landing in night so it will not be so hot down."



A683 represents the proposed landing spot of the upcoming solar mission. Landing will be attempted at night.
