
Dear Dad and Lad,

CAMP REGULATIONS

To help make your stay as safe and as enjoyable as possible, we request that you respect certain Ma-Ka-Ja-Wan traditions.

1. For your protection, please wear shoes at all times.
2. Program areas are specialty areas run by trained staff - - so please enter the areas only when they are open.
3. Do not strip birch bark or cut trees in any way. Please use care with smoking materials. Protect YOUR forest.
4. Inspect for woodticks before going to bed each night.
5. Please do not use aerosol insect repellent inside tents as the ingredients tend to remove the waterproofing from the canvas.
6. Please park your car in the West Camp field-the road around the lake is for camp vehicle traffic only. The speed limit on Camp roads is 20 mph. However, there are many times when lower speeds will be necessary because of conditions.
7. A siren indicates an emergency. If a siren sounds, all Lads and Dads are to assemble at the camp flagpole.
8. The possession and use of alcoholic beverages and firearms are strictly forbidden on the Ma-Ka-Ja-Wan Scout Reservation.

SATURDAY, Activity Areas. 9:00 a.m. to 12:00 noon

Waterfront- Are you an Aquanaut? At the waterfront you can try a surface dive, learn how to use a mask, fins, and snorkel. see the four basic rescue methods demonstrated.

Handicraft- Try your hand at leatherwork and make your own Ma-Ka-Ja-Wan souvenir patch.
