



"The mission of the lodge is to achieve the purpose of the Order of the Arrow as an integral part of the Boy Scouts of America in the council through positive youth leadership under the guidance of the selected capable adults."

The purpose of the Order in four-fold:

-"To recognize those campers-Scouts and Scouters-who best exemplify the Scout Oath an Law in their daily lives and by such recognition cause other campers to conduct themselves in such a manner as to warrant recognition."

-"To develop and maintain camping traditions and spirit."

- -"To promote scout camping, which reaches its greatest effectiveness as a part of the unit's camping program, both year-round and in the summer camp, as directed by the camping committee of the council."
- -"To crystalize the Scout habit of helpfulness into a life purpose of leadership in cheerful service to others." There are three honors in the Order of the Arrow. You are an Ordeal Member, elected by your peers. The next step is Brotherhood. This is accomplished by your own will. The last is Vigil. Vigil Honor members are elected by members of the Order. You are now an Ordeal Member in the OA. You were inducted "not so much for what you have done, but for what you are expected to do." The OA is not to replace your troop, but strengthens the bond that you have developed in your troop. The OA is not meant to be like a forest fire that burns strong and then dies out, it is meant to be a flame of brotherhood that lasts forever. The answers to many of your questions about the OA can be found in the OA Handbook.
