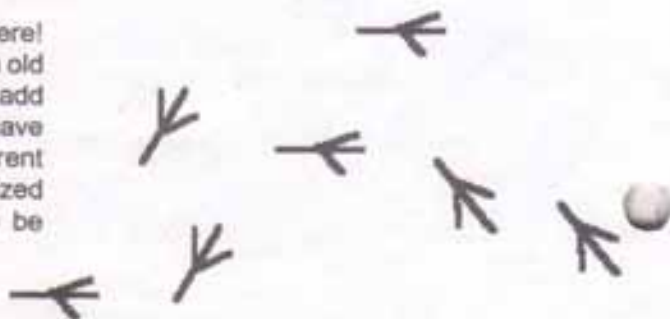
Outfits

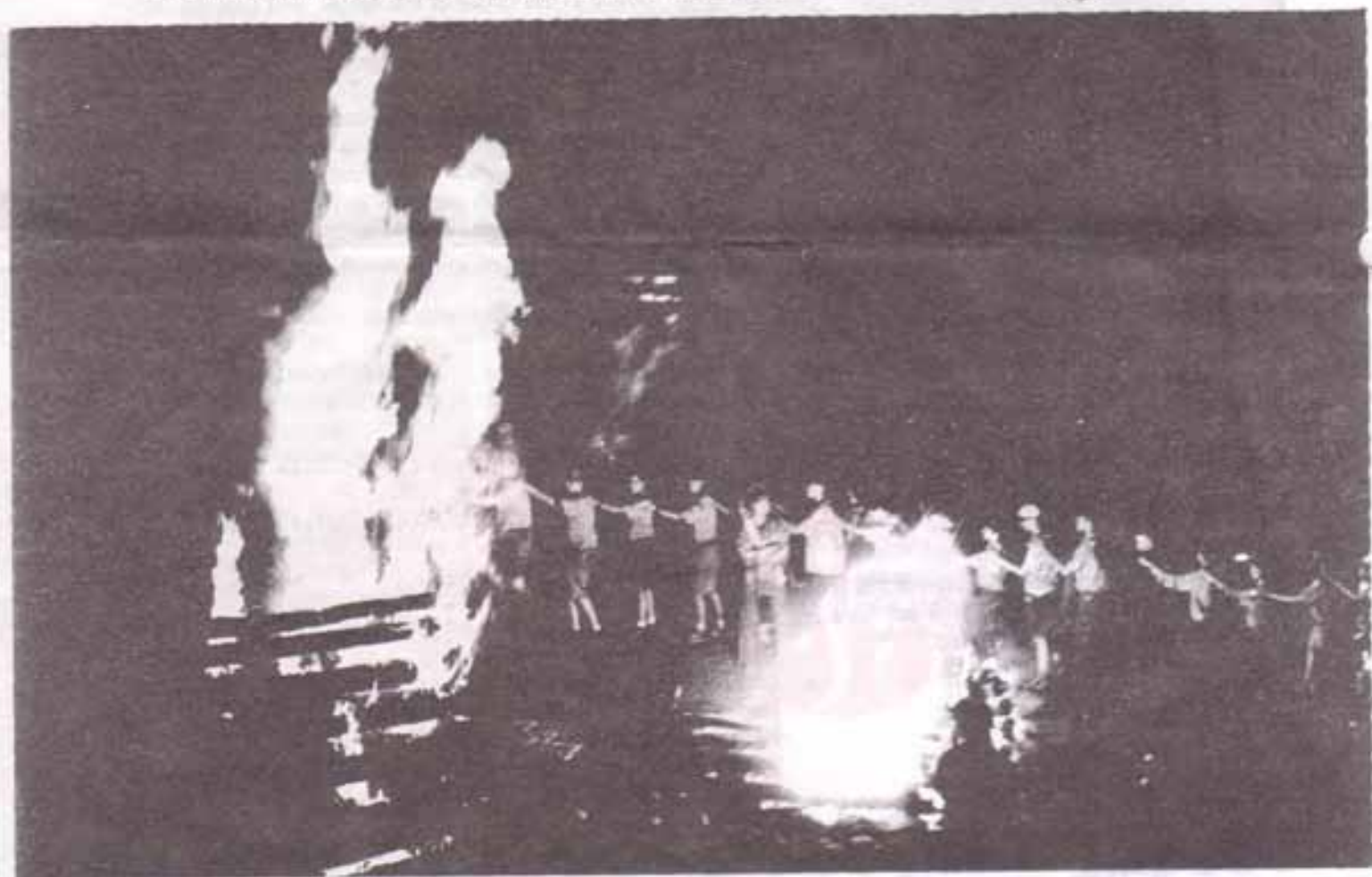
