OA Bowl Project update



The bowl reconstruction project has begun and is in good shape. It will, however, occupy this Lodge for the next two years. It too is a large project. We need to set our sights on another aspect of the project – raising funds. Last year, we sold a commemorative patch that got the project started. With those funds we bought over 350 ties (before this project is over we will need close to 1000). Since then, the project grew in design and scale. We discovered that to do the project properly, we needed to build a better foundation for the ties and use reinforcing techniques to strengthen the wall. These ideas coupled with some nice design elements inspired by the design team, have made the project much larger. So we will be announcing some fundraising programs in the next couple of weeks to help us raise the necessary funds (We need to raise about \$15,000).

Also, we are announcing here that we will have multiple work weekends in the spring. Beginning with the WES worker's weekend, May 21 – 23 (this is for adults only or for adults with their sons only). The Memorial Day Worker's weekend will be our big push. However, as we have to also get camp up and running, we need to a much larger work team this year. We are also looking to attract about 10 additional people to stay one week longer, after Memorial Day so keep the momentum going. This event will happen if we have enough people. We hope to put in one weekend before camp start, with a crew of 10, if we have the people. Let Rob Orr know if you have an interest in any of these dates.
